Re: Recommendation on purchasing 3D masks for use by employees

Due to the current situation of COVID-19 in Hong Kong, employees are generally required to wear masks at work as a preventive measure for infection control. However, wearing a mask to work during the hot summer months, especially when doing physical work outdoors, can make mask-wearing employees feel stuffy and uncomfortable due to the heat and humidity.

The Occupational Safety and Health Council (OSHC) recently published a study on the effects of mask breathability and comfort on the physiology of manual workers. Based on the results, most workers consider that wearing three-dimensional (3D) masks (or fish-mouth shaped masks) is more comfortable than wearing flat masks. In addition, the lower the pressure difference (ΔP) value of the mask, the better the breathability and the more comfortable it is to wear. From the perspective of preventing disease transmission, wearing a comfortable mask can reduce the chance of workers taking off or pulling down the mask due to stuffiness and avoid affecting the infection control effectiveness. In response to the findings of the OSHC, the Labour Department recommends that contractors/employers purchase 3D masks as part of the stock so that employees can choose to use them, especially for those who need to perform physical work in a hot and humid environment. If the 3D masks available for purchase are marked with ΔP value, you can choose to buy those with a lower ΔP value (≤ 3) which indicates better breathability.
